Pride of Marysville NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT AWARDS

The Pride of Marysville Neighborhood Improvement Awards recognize residents and businesses within the city limits that take pride in their property in ways that enhance the overall appearance of the community.

Award winners are drawn from a pool of nominees selected by the community, then are chosen by a committee consisting of a City Councilmember, business community representative, Parks and Recreation representative and two citizens selected at large. The Mayor names his winning selection from the same pool of candidates.

There are four award categories: (Selecting more than one invalidates the nomination)

- Best Home/Pride of the Neighborhood** - Homes consistently well-kept with well-manicured lawns and colorful landscapes, or enhanced with new paint, landscaping or other significant aesthetic improvements.
- Best Block/Neighborhood** - Based on general/neighborhood entrance/gateway appeal and improvements made.
- Best Business** - Business sites with most curb appeal that have attractive landscaping, well-kept appearance, attractive facade, and are assets to their neighborhoods.
- Mayor's Choice** – James Comeford Award focused on improvements in Downtown/Waterfront district. Home or business.

Neighborhood Pride BEGINS WITH YOU!

-  Look at your property objectively. Walk to the curb and view your property as a neighbor or passerby would.
-  Check for peeling paint on home, garage or building facade.
-  Check gutters and downspouts for rust or sags.
-  Check fences and retaining walls for any needed repairs.
-  Check landscaping. Trim evergreens, shrubbery and trees; and plant flowers. Creative and well-maintained landscaping enhances any property.
