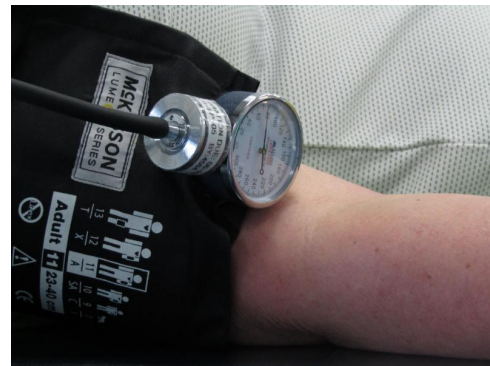
Visit us at the street fair

Follow yard sale sign rules

If you're participating in the [All Marysville Garage Sale](#) Aug. 16-18 or having a sale on your own, Marysville Police and Code Enforcement remind you to please follow city rules for signs.

- Do not attach signs to trees, utility poles, streets lights or traffic signs.
- Signs must be on private property and not create a safety hazard for vehicles or pedestrians.
- Signs cannot be put up more than three days before the sale and must be removed within 24 hours afterward.

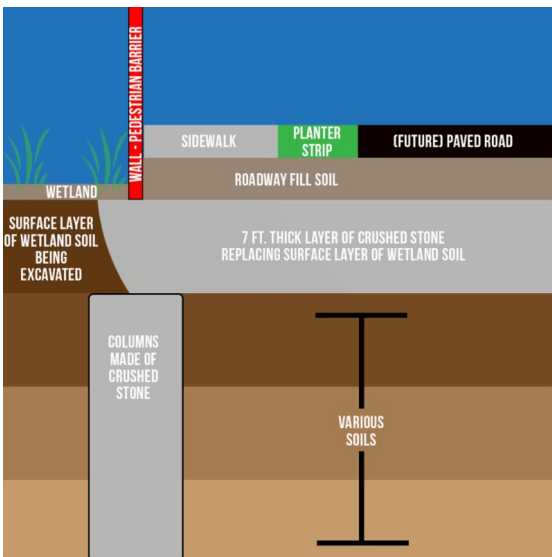
Sign up for CERT

Building the 1st Street Bypass

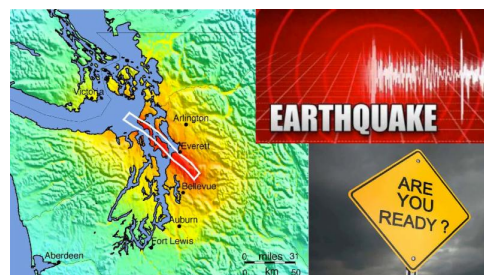


For the past few months, you may have seen a massive rock pile along 1st Street east of State Avenue.

About 25,000 tons of rock is being laid in preparation for the 1st Street Bypass construction. The stone is being vibrated into the ground in stone columns and being laid on the ground to create a stable surface for the future roadway. We expect to complete this preconstruction phase this month.

Tip of the month: Earthquake safety
